The No. 1 Be-friending Agency

Elderpark's project relaunched as face-to-face be-friending is back!

A UNIQUE link-up for us here at Elderpark and an inspirational befriending organisation has been relaunched.

Along with the No.1 Befriending Agency, we have been working together to tackle isolation and loneliness in our communities for over two years – including during the pandemic.

Now with face-to face meetings having returned, the vital service has been relaunched with an appeal for people who can make use of it AND for volunteers who can befriend others to come forward.

This week at a celebratory re-launch held at our offices, local people were given an insight into the impressive work of the No.1 Befriending Agency.

The Agency - which is Glasgow based - recruits volunteers to telephone and visit isolated older people and spend some time with them to have a chat, a cup of tea, and to hear their stories. Befriending calls and visits are tremendously helpful in tackling the problem of loneliness and isolation, because they show people that others care about them and that they have somebody that they can talk to. Befrienders can also serve as a link to a wider network of support available for vulnerable people and can ring the alarm bells if, for example, a person experiences any undue harm. For people without family members close by, this support can be invaluable.

It also runs group befriending sessions where volunteers and befrienders can get together both in person and online.

The link-up with Elderpark was forged in February 2020 thanks to funding obtained by ourselves from the "Investing in Communities" Fund set up by the Scottish Government.

This came immediately prior to the first pandemic lockdown and while the befriending work continued much of it was done over the phone and online focusing with a strong focus being on digital connectivity over the last two years.

Jonathan Giddings-Reid, our Community Regeneration Officer said: "We are delighted to have fully resumed our link-up with the No.1 Befriending Agency Our event was an ideal opportunity for us to showcase just what is on offer to people who are isolated or lonely and also to potential volunteer befrienders who can reach out and offer befriending to others."

Two of those attending the event were Wanda Stalinska and Ela Belczak - both of whom are originally from Poland. They both signed up for the service, appropriately over a cup of tea.

Wanda said: "This is a great idea. We enjoyed coming along to learn more. We were delighted to receive the befriending offer and look forward to meeting new people."

Maintenance News

Improving Your Homes - Windows and Door replacement

This programme was delayed due to the pandemic but we are pleased to report it has now been completed.

Importantly, tenants were able to select uPVC windows – the first of these kind fitted in Elderpark homes, opting for redwood externally and white internally.

Satisfaction is very high and a satisfaction survey will be sent out shortly. We value your feedback and would encourage you to participate.

The contractor, Sidey provided some "community benefits" by supplying and fitting new uPVC fascia and planters at the Alex Ferguson/Govan war ladies at Craigton Rd.



Smoke, Heat and CO detectors upgrade

The Scottish Government passed legislation which came into effect on February 1 st 2022, meaning all homes in Scotland must have smoke detectors which are interlinked. Being interlinked means if one smoke alarm goes off, all the smoke alarms go off. You may not always hear the alarm closest to the fire, especially if you're somewhere else in the house. The association embarked on a programme in 2019 to upgrade these detectors but works



were suspended due to the pandemic with all properties receiving the upgrade by April 2022. The new detection system has a 10 year life span.

We would like to thank all our tenants for their assistance in achieving compliance with this legislation aimed at saving lives.

Electrical Installation Condition Reporting (EICR)

As part of our compliance for the Scottish Housing Quality Standard (SHQS) the association must ensure every property has a valid EICR. By the 31 st March 2022, just under 90% had received a test and we are pleased to say all of our properties have now had this vital safety check carried out.

Refurbishment Works

Over the years the association has been carrying out refurbishment works to our pre 1919 tenement sandstone properties.

Following on from the works completed in Uist Street last year, this year's programme involves those tenants who reside at 231 – 243 Langlands Rd.

73 flats are planned to receive a mixture of new kitchens, bathrooms, boilers and internal doors at a cost of around £750,000 Tenants will be notified of what works they will be receiving.

The contractor is MCN Ltd who are vastly experienced in this work.



Cost of living help from the UK Government - What Eldepark Housing customers need to know

On May 26 the United Kingdom Government announced a substantial package of help in response to the so-called "cost of living crisis."

The aim is to relieve the pressure on household budgets – particularly as a result of soaring energy bills which are expected to rise once again in the autumn.

This package of help affects everyone so we have put together an easy to understand guide for Elderpark Housing tenants and factored owners to cut through the jargon.

Meantime this is what is happening:

Every UK household will receive a £400 energy grant. THIS DOES NOT HAVE TO BE REPAID.

All households with a domestic electricity connection will be automatically eligible for the grant.

Bill payers WILL NOT NEED to contact their energy company as the grant will be automatically applied to every household bill in October.

Direct debit and credit users will have the money credited to their account, while those with pre-payment meters will have the money applied to their meter or paid via a voucher. It replaces the £200 loan announced by the Chancellor earlier this year. This is now scrapped.

Additionally, around eight million of the lowest income households will receive £650. This is over and above the £400 energy grant already mentioned.

It will be paid to households on "means-tested benefits" and will be sent direct to bank accounts.

The Government will make this payment in TWO lump sums, the first from July this year, the second in the Autumn, with payments for those on tax credits following shortly after. Meanwhile, more than eight million pensioner households in receipt of winter fuel payments will be given an extra "pensioner cost-of-living payment" of £300. This is in addition to the money you already receive each year (usually in November or December) to help with winter fuel costs.

Those who receive non-means-tested disability benefits will be sent an extra one-off disability cost-of-living payment of £150 from September.

Many within this group will also receive the £650 payment mentioned earlier taking their total cost of living help to £800.

You do not need to do anything to make sure you receive your payments.

No form-filling and it will be paid via existing account set-ups.

Elderpark Housing fully recognises the difficulties the soaring cost of living is having on our tenants.

If you are having difficulty paying your rent please get in touch with us as soon as possible. Early intervention is essential in order that we can work out how you can manage your rent payments.

Remember we are here to help and when you contact us this is always done in the strictest confidence.

Commenting on the UK Government announcement our Chief Executive Gary Dalziel said: "We welcome any help that relieves the cost of living pressure on our customers. As this situation develops we will keep monitor this situation ad keep you up to date at all times.


The mural created such interest that the Association decided to install another piece of artwork promoting the Central Govan Action Plan slogan, "Get into Govan" slogan at the post office on Craigton Rd.

The Association is excited to announce we are working with artist collaboration GSW3 to install artwork on a tenement gable end on Crossloan Rd as part of the Glasgow mural trail.

The Mural Trail is part of a citywide initiative to rejuvenate streets and revitalize buildings and vacant sites throughout Glasgow transforming them into beautiful pieces of public art.

The planned mural will be a bold colourful and eye-catching piece of artwork showing two birds cradling their young and is based on the theme of migration. The mural below depicts, birds that migrate to warmer safer climates to raise their young and give them the best chance to survive and flourish.


Migrating birds are like people who have come to Govan in search of a better life. When they arrived here they may not speak or understand the dialect but to flourish they made friends, opened businesses, served the community, and raised a family. Through this process they become part of this due to political or



environmental factors have place, and belong to it; they become Govanites and Glaswegians.

GSW3 will be consulting with stakeholders and community groups to get their views and opinions on the mural and the theme behind it with a plan to install the mural by the end of July.

Nimmo Drive Proposed New Development

MAST Architects have been engaging with the JR Group, to develop a proposal for a new build development comprising of 45 units to deliver a mix of 3, 2 and 1 bedroom properties on a site at Nimmo Drive which currently is an industrial unit and the Elderpark Community Centre.

The project is in the very early stages and was submitted for planning earlier this year. It is currently anticipated that should it receive planning consent that work would start on site in 2023.

The pictures shown below are the architects impressions showing what the properties should look like. We will provide further updates on this exciting project as it develops.





Complaints and Compliments

The Association continues to prioritise making improvements in our complaints handling procedure. Changes to how we record these complaints and training so that we remain responsive to complaints are ongoing. This will ultimately bring improvements and help further inform how we learn from issues – in the form of a complaint – which you bring to our attention.

We will always aim to respond to your complaint within the agreed timescales. However, at times the investigation can be more complex or take more time. Our primary consideration is to deliver a quality decision based on facts and evidence and at times this means we do not meet these timescales.

Between 1st January to 31st March 2022 we received a total of **36 complaints** and 34 of these were responded to and closed within the reporting quarter. The breakdown of these can be seen below.

One-tray roast chicken dinner

PREP:20 MINS COOK:1 HR SERVES 4



INGREDIENTS

800g floury potatoes, such as Maris Piper or King Edwards 4 garlic cloves, unpeeled 5 sprigs of thyme, leaves picked 3 tbsp vegetable oil , plus a little extra for drizzling 4 chicken legs 4 carrots 150g frozen peas Gravy, to serve (optional)

Step 1

Put a chopping board on your work surface. Use a vegetable peeler to peel the potatoes. Cut the potatoes into chunks, about the size of golf balls. Put them in a pan and cover with cold water.

Step 2

Put the pan on the hob and turn the heat to high, when the water boils, reduce the heat to medium and set a timer for 8 mins. When the timer beeps, carefully drain the potatoes through a colander in the sink. Leave to dry for a few minutes. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6.

Step 3

Tip the potatoes into your largest roasting tin, add the garlic cloves (no need to peel them first), thyme and drizzle with 2 tbsp oil. Season well and use two spoons to turn the potatoes to coat them in the oil.

Step 4

Put the chicken legs amongst the potatoes or on top. Drizzle with the remaining oil and season with a pinch of salt and pepper. Use your oven gloves to carefully place the tin in the centre of the oven and roast for 30 mins.

Step 5

Carefully remove the tin from the oven and use your spoons to turn the potatoes again – be careful that the hot fat doesn't splash you. Return the tin to the oven for a further 15 mins.

Step 6

Peel the carrots and cut them into long batons, then drizzle with a little extra oil and season.


Step 7

Push the potatoes and chicken to one end of the tin and put the carrots at the other end. Return to the oven for 10 mins.

Step 8

Remove the tin from the tray and carefully stir the peas into the carrots, then return to the oven for a final 5 mins. When the roast is ready, the chicken and potatoes will be crispy and the veggies will be soft. Test the chicken is ready by piercing the thickest part using a knife – the juices should run clear. If not, return to the oven for a further 5 mins and test again. Serve with gravy, if you like.
