Past Survey Results


We would like to know if your views have changed since then on last survey 2019. The key findings included:

- 86% of tenants wanted Elderpark to be involved in regenerating their community.
- The most important types of regeneration, according to respondents, were economic, (you are financially better off) followed by social, (connected to people and services), and finally physical, (the area looks attractive). These priorities aligned with respondents top 4 themes which would make the most difference.
 - 1. Employment and Training
 - 2. Street cleanliness
 - 3. Youth activities
 - 4. Activities for older people
- 87% of tenants agreed that a portion of rental income should be utilized to support regeneration initiatives.

Funding for Regeneration Projects

In terms of funding, our primary income comes from grant funding. However, we also utilize your rent income to top up the funding. This helps make applications more attractive to funders. We also spend your rent on community projects/ events and supporting more vulnerable tenants, as illustrated in the table below. However, should we increase spending on regeneration, this puts pressure on having to set higher rent increases, to cover our landlord responsibilities.
