A Special Recognition for Our Chair Maureen

Our Chairperson Maureen McDonald has triumphed at Scotland's prestigious inaugural SHARE Awards as part of their 40th anniversary celebrations.

Maureen, who has chaired the Association since 2022, was announced as the "Outstanding Contribution to Housing (Volunteer)" at a glittering ceremony in Glasgow.

The Award "honours an individual who has shown a strong sense of community, exceptional dedication, commitment, and impact in their role as a volunteer, board, or committee member."

Maureen's current term as Chairperson caps two periods on Elderpark's Management Committee. Three years ago, she took on the responsibility of being Chair following the sudden ill-health and passing of the existing Chair and, by her own admission, this was a role she hadn't anticipated taking on.

Her total length of service on the Committee extends to more than 20 years coming in various stints over the years.

Born locally, she has lived in Govan all her life bringing up three children and is now a great grandmother.

Maureen has had a diverse career over the years, from being a highly skilled shoe maker, a precision engineer and welder to her final post before retirement as a social worker. Her most recent period of service at Elderpark began in 2014 when she re-joined the Management Committee "to be a voice for tenants and help to deliver change."

Maureen said: "I am deeply honoured to have won this award and to be honest a little bit taken aback. Community-based housing associations like Elderpark perform such a vital role in neighbourhoods across Scotland and I am proud to be part of this organisation which seeks to deliver good homes and a positive community within Govan."

"As a proud Govan-ite I am happy that by being part of Elderpark Housing I can play a part in the future of the area of which I am immensely passionate about."

Our Chief Executive Gary Dalziel added: "Elderpark Housing is 50 this year and Maureen has lived within the community throughout our existence. From being a committee member, she has grown effortlessly into the role of Chairperson.

"You couldn't find a more passionate advocate for Govan and in particular Elderpark. Maureen attends every meeting and event in the community within her voluntary capacity and is always supportive, friendly, kind and genuine which are traits which make her such a valued leader of the Association.

Football Focus for Elderpark

Elderpark Housing served up a winner in the form of support for young footballers at a popular community football tournament.

Organised by the Govan Youth Information Project (GYIP), the annual "Govan Fair Cup Tournament" offered a fun-packed football occasion to young teams from across the Govan community and beyond.

It was held in Ibrox at community pitches in the shadow of Ibrox stadium – home, of course, to Rangers FC.

The awards presentation took place at Edmiston House, which houses the Rangers Club Shop, Museum and an event venue, in a glitzy sporting celebration of the tournament. Two trophies were presented to the winning teams – both from the local area - St Saviour's Primary for the boys and Craigton Primary for the girls.

Our special 50th anniversary logo was engraved on the winners' trophies for each of the girls' and boys' winners.

Gary Dalziel, our Chief Executive said: "We were delighted to support this event and recognise that bringing children together in competitive sport has huge advantages within the local community." "The Govan Youth Information Project has played a vital role in Govan since 1994 – supporting young people at every turn and the football tournament is a hugely-popular event which has grown in size annually offering fun for local boys and girls.

"We have worked with GYIP for many years and it was extra special to recognise our 50th anniversary with those young persons from the community who will be part of Govan for decades to come."

GYIP Youth Worker John Aitken said: "We can't thank Elderpark Housing enough for its generous sponsorship as it celebrates its 50th birthday.

"The tournament was the busiest we have ever organised with 12 teams and over 230 boys and girls' enjoying the occasion. There was a great atmosphere, and the emphasis was firmly on ensuring they all had a great time."

GYIP's aim is to deliver "empowering and meaningful" youth work to all children and young people within Govan and like Elderpark Housing is committed to the development and regeneration of the local community.

The tournament was also supported by Govan Housing Association, Linthouse Housing Association and a wide range of partner organisations.

Rent Arrears Handling Procedure Update

Elderpark Housing has launched a new, simplified Rent Arrears Procedure aimed at providing a clearer and more efficient process for managing rent arrears.



The updated policy reduces the previous fivestage system to a streamlined three-stage procedure. This change is designed to allow for quicker escalation where needed, ensuring prompt action can be taken to support tenants and protect tenancies.

As part of the new approach, tenants will now be allowed a maximum of three repayment arrangements. This encourages rent to remain a top priority and supports tenants in maintaining regular, sustainable payments.

Once the initial stages of the arrear's procedure has been exhausted, court action will be initiated. When court action is initiated, all members of the household (for those over 16 or within a few months of turning 16) will be notified in writing that court action has commenced.

Elderpark Housing remains committed to early intervention and supporting tenants through any financial difficulties. Elderpark Housing provide an inhouse Financial Inclusion Service, Tenancy Sustainment Support and we work closely with Citizens Advice Bureau. If you require tenancy support, please get in touch and we will refer you to the relevant service.

A reminder that rent is charged on the 1st of every month and we encourage rent payment in advance. Therefore, rent payments should be paid before the 1st of every month.

How to pay rent? Rent can be paid by card over the phone or in our office. You can set up a Direct Debit for ongoing payments. You can also order an Allpay card where you are able to make payments online or at a Paypoint.

Bed Bugs

Over the last months we have received increasing numbers of tenants reporting infestations of bed bugs. Bed bugs are small, flat insects that can be hard to see if you don't know they're there. If they're in your home, they've probably crawled in or been carried in on clothing or furniture. Getting rid of bed bugs can be hard and take a long time.

Preventing bed bugs

- Wash and dry your bedding and clothes often, using the hottest setting
- Keep your home tidy so bed bugs have fewer places to hide



- Vacuum regularly
- Be careful with second-hand furniture and inspect it before bringing it into your home
- How to spot bed bugs
- Bite marks on your skin after sleeping,
 especially on your neck, arms, hands, and legs
- Small dark spots on your mattress or bedding
- Live bed bugs on your bedding or furniture, like couches
- Shed skins from bed bugs these can look like droppings

Removing bed bugs

- Wash and dry your bedding and clothes at the hottest setting
- Clean your home and the affected room
- Get help from a professional cleaning company

Improving Your Homes Inside and Out

It's been a busy few months for the Asset Team at Elderpark Housing, and we wanted to update you on the work we're doing to improve your homes and introduce you to the new faces joining our team to make it happen.



Kitchen, Bathroom and Heating Improvements

You might have noticed increased activity across our homes as we've been working with CCG, a Glasgow-based contractor, on a kitchen, bathroom and heating replacement programme. This isn't just about upgrading individual components - it's about creating warmer, more comfortable homes that cost less to run.

The new kitchens aren't just about looking good (though they do!), they're designed to be more practical for everyday family life. The bathroom improvements focus on accessibility and comfort. And the heating upgrades are delivering real benefits for residents/tenants and hopefully lower energy bills this winter.

We know building works can be disruptive, so we wanted to thank everyone who's been patient while we've been on site. The feedback from residents whose work is complete has been positive. CCG's team has been professional throughout, and it's clear they understand they're working in people's homes, not just buildings.

Over the next 9 months we expect to install 120 new gas boilers, 26 new kitchens and 30 new bathrooms at a cost of over £700,000.00.



Strengthening Our Team

We've also been strengthening our Asset Team with two key appointments that will directly benefit residents.

years of experience
in housing,
construction,



and energy management across Scotland and beyond. His focus is on ensuring Elderpark deliver improvements that genuinely enhance your quality of life while making your homes more efficient and sustainable. He's particularly passionate about retrofit and energy efficiency, making sure we're not just maintaining homes but actively improving them for the future.

We've also welcomed Patricia Fraser as our new Asset Officer (Safety & Compliance). Patricia is responsible for ensuring all our electrical installations (EICR's) and gas safety checks are completed to the highest standards. This isn't just about meeting regulatory requirements - it's about keeping you and your families safe in your homes. Patricia brings extensive experience of social housing and Elderpark, having worked for the Association since 2021, and she's already making a real difference to how we manage these critical safety checks.

Window Replacement Programme Starting Soon

Looking ahead, we're excited to announce that



we've awarded a contract to Sidey, a Scottish glazing company, for a comprehensive window replacement programme that will begin over the coming weeks. This represents a significant investment in improving your homes' energy efficiency and comfort.

The new windows will deliver several benefits: better insulation meaning warmer homes and lower heating costs, improved security, reduced condensation problems, and better noise insulation from outside. Sidey has an excellent track record of working in occupied properties, understanding that this is about improving your homes while minimising disruption to your daily lives.

We've chosen to work with a Scottish company because we believe in supporting local businesses and ensuring we have accessible, reliable service for any future maintenance needs. The programme will be rolled out systematically across our properties, and affected residents will receive advance notice of when work will begin in their area.



Looking Forward

All of this work shows Elderpark Housing's commitment to improving our/your homes. We're not just maintaining properties - we're actively investing in making them better places to live. The combination of internal improvements through the kitchen, bathroom and heating programme, enhanced safety compliance, and the upcoming window replacements will deliver homes that are warmer, more comfortable, more secure, and cheaper to run.



The Tenants Information Service

National research study seeks views from tenants from ethnic minority backgrounds in Scotland's social housing sector. Interviews are



informal and confidential, and everyone who takes part gets a £20 voucher as a thank you.

Are you from an ethnic minority background and live in social housing in Scotland?

If so, we want to hear from you to help shape an important, national research study that aims to pave the way for a more inclusive future for tenant participation and engagement practices in Scotland.

About the research study

The Tenants Information Service (TIS),

commissioned by The Scottish Government, is leading a national research study which aims to gain a better understanding of the baseline of tenant participation and engagement amongst tenants from ethnic minority backgrounds within the Scottish social housing sector. Findings from the research study will inform a national report focused on identifying the barriers which affect participation and between social housing providers and tenants from ethnic minority backgrounds. The findings will look to break down and overcome these barriers to foster fresh approaches to tenant participation – which enable all tenants to have their say in the housing decisions that affect them, their families, and communities.

Why this matters

The introduction of the Housing (Scotland) Act 2001 made it a legal requirement for social landlords in Scotland to actively develop and support tenant participation. This means all Councils (Local Authorities) and Registered Social Landlords (RSLs), such as housing associations

and housing co-operatives, must work with tenants and involve them when making decisions about their homes and communities. The law also says every social landlord must have a Tenant Participation Strategy in place.

To be truly effective, tenant participation works best when tenants from all backgrounds and walks of life are represented and have opportunities to take an active role in shaping housing services that reflect their needs and priorities.

What is tenant participation?

Tenant participation is about giving people a say in decisions about your home and community. It helps improve services, strengthen communities, and ensures your social landlord is listening to the views of tenants – working with you to improve the housing services that you receive. 
We spoke to 600 Elderpark HA tenants to assess satisfaction with the services their landlord provides. This is done to report back to the Scottish Housing Regulator and allows the Association to monitor and improve their services for customers. This newsletter presents an overview of the key findings from the 2025 survey and compares these to the results from the Association's 2022 tenant survey and also the Scottish Average for all social landlords for the year 2023/2024.

Taking everything into account, how satisfied are you with the overall service provided by Elderpark HA?

89% of you told us that you were either very or fairly satisfied with the **overall service provided by your landlord**. This is not significantly different than the 2022 survey (91%).





How good or poor do you feel your landlord is at keeping you informed about their services and decisions?







How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the opportunities given to you to participate in your landlord's decision making processes?






92% of you said you were satisfied with **participation opportunities,** which is not significantly different than the 2022 result (89%).


Thinking about the LAST time you had repairs carried out, how satisfied or dissatisfied were you with the repairs service provided by your landlord?

90% of you said you were very or fairly satisfied with the **quality of your home**. This is not significantly different than the 2022 survey (89%).



Taking into account the accommodation and services your landlord provides, to what extent do you think that the rent for this property represents good or poor value for money?






Overall, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with your landlord's contribution to the management of the neighbourhood you live in?

The news comes as we reveal two new developments in our plans to mark this milestone.


A Glasgow City Council civic reception is to be held in Elderpark's honour in August and plans are underway to create a new mural to bring colour to this vibrant community.
